

Craig's Story

When Craig was asked to leave home at 16 by his mum, his life was heading in a downhill direction. Craig's mum felt unable to cope as Craig drifted into spending more time on the streets, taking drugs and hanging around with a bad crowd.

Placed in a children's home, Craig was feeling stuck in life. He was desperate for independence but couldn't see a way of being able to support himself. He became more frustrated and bitter about his future.

Thankfully, just when things were looking very bleak for Craig, he found crucial support through a special Wooden Spoon funded project – HITZ.

With their help, Craig was given the support he needed to develop a focus and learn life skills in order to support himself. The programme enabled him to get involved in education again, learn employability skills and boost his self-esteem through rugby.

Craig secured himself a job with the local council; he now lives in his own accommodation and has a great support network. He has even started rebuilding a relationship with his mum.

Murad's Story

Murad was born with a rare kidney condition but his spirit defied his early prognosis. Now 16 and attending a mainstream secondary school, he is a familiar face at Richard House Children's Hospice in East London that has been providing support to around 300 families whose children and young adults have life-limiting conditions for the last 15 years.

"It has made me stronger. I can't change my son's condition but we can deal with it the best we can and having the right support, someone here I can talk to if I have any concerns, is great."

Bespoke projects that cover buildings, extensions, transport and activity aids.




Playgrounds & Outdoor Activity Areas

Disability sports club, Dundee Dragons, were thrilled to be presented with specialist sports wheelchairs after turning to Wooden Spoon Scotland for help.

The club, which was formed to provide active wheelchair users in the area the opportunity to get fit, struggled to cater for all members due to equipment costs. Wooden Spoon donated £15,000 to the Scottish club, funding five specialist quad wheelchairs and bringing the Dragon's wheelchair rugby ambitions to life.

The game, which is otherwise known as 'murderball', gives players with neurological conditions such as tetraplegia, muscular dystrophy and cerebral palsy as well as those with amputations affecting three or more limbs the chance to get involved in this exciting full-contact sport.

"Up until now we have been unable to fully cater for our members who also have impairments in their upper limbs, but thanks to the generosity of Wooden Spoon these players now have the equipment necessary in order to get the most out of their training going forward"

Helping Children With Cancer

Wooden Spoon donated £54k to Cancer Fund for Children to fund a playroom at Daisy Lodge recently.

The grant was given to fund the playroom at the short break facility which recently opened at the foothills of the Mourne Mountains in County Down.

The facility enables the charity to provide free short breaks to up to 500 families per year affected by cancer in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

Wooden Spoon is committed to funding projects that make a dramatic difference to families experiencing extreme hardship.
